



COL Jennifer Menetrez, MD, began her US Army career while attending Wellesley College through the ROTC program at MIT. She received her MD degree from the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences then performed a categorical surgical internship at William Beaumont Army Medical Center in Texas. Following internship, COL Menetrez served two years as a General Medical Officer in Germany, during which time she deployed to Saudi Arabia. She then completed a residency in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at Walter Reed Army Medical Center (WRAMC), followed by four years as the attending physician for the WRAMC inpatient rehab service and gait lab, among other duties. In the year 2000 she transferred to Brooke Army Medical Center in San Antonio, Texas, where she served as chief of the Physical Medicine Service and Department Performance Improvement committee, and was the lead figure in establishing the Center for the Intrepid (CFI). As the Director of the CFI she has the privilege of caring for service members who have had severe war-related injuries, to include amputations, burns, and limb salvage procedures. She is board certified in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation and subspecialty board certified in Pain Management.
